The School

Founded in 1960, Duchesne Academy of the Sacred Heart is Houston's Catholic, all-girls', age three through grade 12 identity-forming, college preparatory school. As a member of the Network of Sacred Heart Schools, Duchesne's foundational Sacred Heart Goals and Criteria and the 200-year-old legacy of the Religious of the Sacred Heart shape daily life at the school. Duchesne extends opportunities for personal realization and intellectual growth to each child through a comprehensive reading and writing program, an immersive and advanced STEM program, an award-winning national robotics team, progressively in-depth discussions and college-level research preparation, passion-building offerings across the arts and athletics, and extensive, perspective-widening service learning engagements.

Our student population includes girls from a variety of nationalities, religious denominations, and socioeconimic backgrounds. This diversity adds a rich dimension to our learning environment. Upper School reports 36% diversity; 32% of Duchesne students self identify as U.S. citizens of color and 4% self identify as multi-cultural. Also, 67% of our student body self identify as Catholic. Approximately \$1.4 million in tuition assistance was distributed to 19% of the 701 enrolled students.

Duchesne has 230 young women in grades 9-12. Admission is based on the ISEE test or portfolio, a personal visit, and school/teacher recommendations.
